Leonard HAMILTON 7th Year

Hamilton was hired on March 19, 2002 to return the Seminole men's basketball program to the glory it had earned when it played for the 1972 national championship and regularly competed for, and won, conference championships during the 1980's and early 1990's.

Hamilton was the Washington Wizards' head coach in 2001 and the head coach at the University of Miami for ten years prior to that (1991-00) when he became the eighth head coach in Florida State men's basketball history. In his final season at Miami, Hamilton guided the Hurricanes to their second straight 20-win season, a share of the Big East regular season championship and the school's first trip to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.

At the end of the 1999 season. He was named **Big East Coach of the Year** for the second time. **ACC Coach of the Year 2009**—almost unanimous



Paul HEWITT 9th Year Since 2000-01

Named 12th head coach in Georgia Tech basketball history on April 6, 2000 ... in five years at Tech, Hewitt has guided the Yellow Jackets to postseason play four times, including three NCAA Tournament berths ... in 2004-05, he led the Jackets to their second consecutive 20-win season, a first for Georgia Tech since 1989-90 ... in 2003-04, the Yellow Jackets tied a school record with 28 wins and advanced to the National Championship game ... in 2001, Hewitt became only the second first-year coach to earn ACC Coach of the Year honors ... prior to his arrival at Tech, Hewitt guided Siena College to two postseason appearances and an average of 22 wins in three seasons as a head coach in his second year, Siena finished with a 25-6 record, the school's first-ever MAAC Tournament Championship and an NCAA Tournament appearance.
