Leonard Hamilton, was named the National Coach of the Year by Basketball Times and the ACC Coach of the Year by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association in 2009 Hamilton was the Washington Wizards' head coach in 2001 and the head coach at the University of Miami for ten years prior to that (1991-00) when he became the eighth head coach in Florida State men's basketball history.

In his final season at Miami, Hamilton guided the Hurricanes to their second straight 20-win season, a share of the Big East regular season championship and the school's first trip to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.

At the end of the 1999 season. He was named **Big East Coach of the Year** for the second time....**ACC Coach of the Year 2009 Almost unanimous**

**Steve DONOHUE 2nd Year** Since 2010-11---49y Old Replaced Al Skinner---13 seasons(1997-98 through 2009-10)

Donahue led Cornell to three consecutive Ivy League titles (2008-2010) and a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet 16.

In his 10 seasons leading the Big Red, Donahue totaled a 146-138 record. Cornell achieved the best Ivy record over the last five years (55-15) and Donahue was recognized for his work by being named a court coach by USA Basketball for the Under-18 national team trials in Washington, D.C., Was 4 year letterman in Bkb and Baseball @ Urisinius College(Bears)
